

Biosecurity Checklist - Movement on Property

The Facey Group advise all visitors to farm properties to take a few minutes diligence following the below precautions.

Is your vehicle clean?

NO aggregated soil on or under vehicle. NO grass or thistle heads or other plant parts of any kind on or under vehicle.

Arrive at the farm.

- Take notice of any signs, particular Biosecurity warnings at the farm gate.
- Be aware of any Biosecurity concerns on the property you are visiting eg is there doublegees in the paddock
- Give the farmer the opportunity to take you over the property of the farm. If you are on a group tour stay with the group.

Entering and leaving each paddock during inspection

Leave the gate as you find it; check tyres for doublegees and rest of vehicle for plant residues such as thistles or radish on leaving the paddock

Leave each farm with a clean vehicle

Keep an eye open for doublegees, calthrop or any other easily transportable weed hazard, such as thistles. Plant residues such as radish should be removed.

Doublegees should be collected from tyres and put in closed container. Clean any aggregated soil off vehicle, including tyres.

Between properties

Take precautions to prevent spreads of weeds and stock disease – inspect and clean boots for doublegees, soil and animal faeces.
